

## **Letter from the Rectory**

This year, Ash Wednesday - the first day of Lent - 14th February - is also Valentine's Day - the day for lovers.

Some might think that ironic because they see Lent as a season without much love. Many view it as a time when we're called to be harsh and restrictive on ourselves; a time when we're encouraged to almost loathe ourselves.

But this couldn't be further from the truth. Lent is an opportunity to set aside all the distractions of life and to face up to emotions such as pride and anger which so often cloud our judgement, so as to earth ourselves again in the reality of what really matters in life. That, it strikes me, isn't a process of loathing ourselves. By opening ourselves up to the possibility of an honest encounter with God, it's a healthy process of loving ourselves.

Of course, Valentine's Day is a celebration of a different kind of love: of romantic love - and an answer to the prayers of retailers of flowers, chocolates, jewellery, and bottles of pink fizz! For those particularly in the first flush of love, it's a day to remember.

But for many, love is a bit more complex than that, not least because, when we use the word 'love' in English, it can mean so many different things. In some ways, the Greeks have made an easier job of it by having up to eight different

words for love. each with a subtly different meaning. So, for example,

'eros' denotes sexual passion and 'philia' relates to the love of platonic friendship or brotherly love.

But what about the love often talked about in the Bible? Well, that's derived from the Greek word 'agape'. 'Agape' is considered the highest form of love: selfless, unconditional, and sacrificial. It's a deeper love which, once all other loves have been burnt away, doesn't look for something in return. It's therefore not even necessarily about feelings. It's the sacrificial love one finds on the battlefield for one's neighbour, for humanity, and for the greater good. It's the love which Christ showed on a Roman cross for each one of us. It's the love which, despite our frequent rejection of him, God shows for humanity and his creation.

As we journey over the next six weeks from Ash Wednesday towards Easter at the end of March, love - not loathing - should be at the heart of our thinking as we try to understand how and why, through his passion, Jesus was and is able to look upon us with a continuous agape love, even as the soldiers nailed him to a cross. It's a love which can transform our love on Valentine's Day - and every day - so that we too can resonate with God's agape love, to the very end of all love.

#### **Down at the Doctors**

Firstly, a belated Happy New Year to you and a very big thank you from all the staff for the generous Christmas treats!

Before handing over to Dr Rajah I want to do a quick recap on appointments. Appointments are split between those that are urgent on the day (65%) and those that are routine (35%).

Patients can ring from 8.30am with any urgent on the day requests. The reception team will ask for a brief reason for the request. solely to allocate the patient to the appropriate Doctor or Nurse. You will also be asked if vou would prefer a face-to-face or telephone appointment.

If it's a routine appointment you require, please call after 9.30am and you will be allocated an appointment in the next week or sooner depending on availability.

We do monitor appointments and demand daily and if needed tweak the system. For example, just before Christmas rather than sending the paramedic on home visits we created a minor illness clinic. At the time there were lots of coughs, colds, sore throats and possible chest infections. Of the 22 appointments we created for him 19 were for these ailments and this certainly took the pressure off the other GPs to concentrate on more serious conditions.

Hello, I am Dr Dayan Mathanarajah known as Dr Rajah and I have been with the practice for a couple of years. I qualified in 2018 from London University and started my career as a salaried GP in Welwyn Garden City and at the same time was a locum GP at various practices in Herts. Upon arriving at Much Hadham I was pleasantly surprised by the warmth exuded by both staff and patients and the unique connection between the two. I was also very impressed by the excellent patient access, a rare gem in the world of healthcare. For me patient access is like Wi-Fi - you only notice it when it's not working!

Aside from the routine general practice responsibilities I have trained to do minor surgery alongside Dr Sharif. Her Friday skin clinic has been a great success and together we tackle the benign lumps and bumps that have been assessed by the consultant dermatologist for removal in house. I also wear another hat as the St Elizabeth's GP responsible for the residents with epilepsy and very complex needs.

Outside of work life revolves around the family with my wife and two very young boys and the chaos that comes with parenthood. It is like having my own little medical research team at home - they keep me on my toes!

Anyway, enough about me - in summary I am extremely happy I made the decision to join Much Hadham and I look forward to being your doctor for many years to come.





# Sowing Seeds from February onwards

- is something that some gardeners avoid, but it's easy when you know how. Germination is triggered by the correct combination of light levels, temperature and moisture – get these right, and the seed will start to grow. Sowing seed is a simple and inexpensive way of growing

new flowers and vegetables for your garden. Sowing seed indoors allows you to start the growing year much earlier than if sowing seeds outside.

You don't need a lot of kit to sow seeds. Many gardeners buy expensive propagators but a seed tray or a few plastic pots, will do the job. If you don't have plastic pots then try using old yoghurt pots with holes punched in the bottom, or tomato or mushroom punnets instead of a seed tray. Any vessel that can hold compost and allow water to drain freely is suitable.

Buy peat-free, multi-purpose, compost. Avoid damping off - low light levels and stuffy indoors can both encourage damping off - a fungal disease that sweeps through trays of seedlings. Prevent it by using fresh compost with perlite added, watering trays/pots from below and opening propagator vents during the day.

Some very small seeds need specialist 'seed compost' to germinate, but multipurpose compost is fine for most seeds.

Fill small pots or seed trays with compost. Use a watering can fitted with a fine rose to water the compost, and leave to drain.

Sprinkle seeds evenly and thinly over the surface of the compost. Cover seeds with a thin layer of compost, about the same depth as the size of the seed (the smaller the seed, the thinner the layer of compost).

Cover the pot with a clear polythene bag or piece of glass or clear plastic, to maintain an even temperature for germination, and keep the compost moist. Place the pot of seeds on a well-lit windowsill or in a heated propagator.

Remove the plastic or glass cover as soon as the seeds have germinated and you can see the seedlings growing out of the compost. Grow them in a warm place indoors – if growing them on a windowsill you may need to move them at night as temperatures can drop dramatically. The young plants will be ready to be 'pricked' out when the second pair of leaves, known as 'true' leaves, emerges.

When pricking out seedlings, handle them only by their leaves, not the stem. Fill a larger seed tray or small pots with compost and plant seedlings, burying them up to the base of the first set of leaves.

After a couple of weeks, the young plants will be large enough to pot individually into 7.5cm pots, or planted outside in well-prepared soil. Handle plants gently, firm compost around them and water well. Don't allow the soil or compost to dry out.

Two, however, have snapped about 1 metre up the trunk but fortunately neither pose a risk to those using the wood. A willow near the gate at the Polo Club is wedged in an oak whilst an Ash has snapped well off the path in the northeast corner.



There will be a chance for youngsters to help plant wildflowers that I have brought on in my garden, so jobs for the whole family. 

#### **Nature Notes**

At the end of 2023 I forwarded all my moth records to the county recorder. In total, 16,322 moths were recorded, made up of an amazing 513 species. My best year for 12 years. Many were from my ongoing survey of Stocking Wood, where I added 83 new species to the wood records.

This year, I managed to record 25 new species for the parish, taking the total species I have encountered over the last 12 years to 849. A reasonably pleasing total. All records for the whole of the county show that over 1600 moths have been observed and identified, so to have in excess of 50% in one rural parish is pretty good.

My regular survey of Stocking Wood continues and I am, even on cold nights with minus temperatures, coming across new species. Only on Sunday 14th Jan I found a small fly species on a tree trunk: Leuphenga maculata. We also had a work party in the wood in early January, but still much to be achieved this winter.

A trip to Abberton Reservoir on the coldest Thursday of the winter was excellent, with some good birds noted, including Goldeneye, Goosander, Great White Egret and Rock Pipit. Well worth the 3rd degree frost bite!





















#### St Cecilia's Church Bells

Quasi

#### **Notre-Dame**

Some of you might
wonder why each article
is signed off by Quasi.
Well it's Quasimodo, the
Hunchback of Notre-Dame
who was the cathedral's
fictional hunchback bell
ringer depicted in the
1831 novel and the Disney
film. Quasimodo was
feared by the townspeople
as a sort of monster
who eventually found
sanctuary in an unlikely love with
gypsy beauty, Esmeralda.

With that in mind the terrible fire at Notre-Dame on 15th April 2019 shocked the world. The damage caused run into hundreds of millions of Euros, donors contributed over EURO 840 million. The spire with its three carillon bells and the oak roof were lost but fortunately, the cathedral's ten bells in the two towers survived but only just, as the fire was reportedly only a few minutes from engulfing them.

Each of the ten bells is rung by being swung by an electric motor back and forth through 45 degrees in the 'Continental' style. English style ringing is 'full circle ringing' where the bells swing through a full 360 degree.

Notre-Dame's largest bell dates from the 15th century. It was recast in 1681 at the request of King Louis XIV who named it the Emmanuel Bell. Located in the south tower and weighing just over 13 tons it is said to be one of the most beautiful and remarkable sound



vessels in Europe. The remaining nine bells were all recast in 2012 at the Royal Eijsbouts bell foundry at Ashen in the Netherlands. The ten bells together weigh a total of 22 tons.

At the request of the Archbishop of Canterbury & York and the Prime Minister, the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers asked bellringers accross the UK to ring out on Thursday 18th April 2019 in solidarity with Notre-Dame following the devastating fire. This was Maundy Thursday when normally ringing activities are curtailed during holy week but these were exceptional circumstances. Our local bells rung with half muffles which mean the bell strikes normally on one side of the bell but hardly rings on the other.

Notre-Dame is expected to reopen in December 2024 although it may take 10 to 40 years to completely restore.





# The Hundred Parishes Society

Chilly conditions often greet us as we step outside in the early months of the year. The old saying - "When the wind is out of the East, tis never good for man nor beast" - certainly rings true. Before the advent of broadcast weather forecasts, people had to rely on checking nearby weathervanes for the wind direction. These were usually found on tall buildings such as church spires, while Audley End House has gilded weathervanes mounted on eight corner turrets. Today, a variety of designs can be seen.

Robert McFarlane's books of old words include about fifty that describe winds, storms or clouds. One Essex term he mentions is aigrish, used to describe a sharp cutting wind. The East Anglian word for a strong sudden gust is gussock, or twitchy for an unsteady wind.

Forecasting the weather for those who till the soil is helpful as weeks of westerly winds can bring relentless rain causing waterlogging of the ground, while cold easterly winds dry out the soil and retard growth.

Currently, the UK Meteorological Office operates over 200 official automated sites, each recording accurate measurements of temperature, wind speed and direction, and the amount of precipitation. These readings are processed by powerful computers and the results enable forecasters to make predictions about future weather conditions. Local recording sites include the Cambridge Botanic Gardens and Stansted Airport. By

searching the Met Office website www. metoffice.gov.uk you can check the local weather forecast to help plan your day.

Many individuals or schools are interested in operating a personal weather station and the Met Office is keen to enhance the weather observations network; it asks those who have a personal weather station, manual or automatic, to send data to its Weather Observations Website, WOW, at wow.metoffice.gov.uk

I am writing this as volunteers work to clear the Gardens of fallen trees and boughs brought down by the torrential rains and winds at the beginning of January. Hopefully February will be seasonal with some cold weather, of course, but also with some of those lovely bright winter days on which it is a joy to be outside, seeing the early flowers emerge.

For us that means snowdrops, and with luck some aconites too. The snowdrops have spread hugely through the Gardens in recent years - partly because we have planted extra, but also because we have been careful to leave grass cutting till after the bulbs have replenished themselves and divided, producing extra bulbs; and after they have formed seeds, which apparently are planted unwittingly by ants carrying them into their nests!

We don't have as many aconites as we would like. Their bright yellow flowers make for such a cheery sight, often coming a bit before the snowdrops. They are native to Italy, Bulgaria, the Balkans, Turkey and Iraq. I have read they were introduced to Britain in 1596 and were first recorded as being naturalised in the wild in 1838. We have some longstanding clumps - I wonder when they were planted? But we have found it difficult to establish more. We keep trying though!!

Our open days for snowdrops are on Sunday 18, Thursday 22, Sunday 25 and Thursday 29 February and we have our fingers crossed that the snowdrops will be at their best then. Gates open at 11.00 and tickets will be purchasable in advance through our website or direct through www.Trybooking.com.
