You should consider becoming a Parish Councillor if:

- You want to do something positive for your community
- You want to spend your time productively
- You can: Think, Listen and Act locally.

The Role

- Parish Councillors have overall responsibility for your local community:
 - Councillors have three main areas of work:
 - Delivering services and facilities to meet your local needs
 - Striving to improve quality of life within your village
 - Representing your neighbourhood
- The day-to-day work of a parish councillor may include:
 - Attending meetings of local organisations and groups
 - Attending meetings of bodies that affect the wider community, such as the police, the Highways Authority, schools and colleges taking up issues on behalf of members of the public that effect your local area running a surgery for residents to bring up issues, communicating with individual residents

Effort Required TIME

It is possible to spend a lot of time on council work – but most people have jobs, families and hobbies that also demand a lot of time. However, as with most things, the more you put in, the more you (and your community) will get out.
