Minutes of the **Little Hadham Parish Council** (2019 – 2023 Session) held in the Little Hadham Village Hall Tuesday 7th December 2021 at 7:30 p.m.

21.10.01 To receive and accept apologies for absence. Cllr Arkell sent his apologies, which were received and accepted.

21.10.02 Public Issues Public Issues Members of the public and councillors can raise matters of concern. Suffylds wood – a question was asked regarding requiring planning permission for the owners to make an entrance onto the road. Cllr Williamson's comments from his email to the Parish Council: "Following residents' concerns I reported the entranceway works at the eastern end of the site as a potential planning breach, knowing that no planning permission has been applied for. This has now been investigated by the EHC Planning Team who have visited the site and made contact with the owner. The owner has confirmed the surface being laid will be permeable, and therefore from the Planning viewpoint this is allowable under permitted development, i.e., planning permission is not required. Furthermore, as the road is an unclassified road, the creation of an access from the main road is also within permitted development and does not need specific permission from Highways.

The owner of the land said there are three Ash trees suffering from Ash die back, and that no works will be carried out without professional arborists present and no works will be done without all relevant paperwork being completed. The road is closed from the 17th to the 24th of December. It is for open reach scheduled work.

The fence has also been removed and not replaced. Jonathan Wright said they were going to be affected by the works and the bypass Steve said he would raise with East Herts

Under current planning legislation some extensions to dwellings can be carried out without express planning permission. If an owner or occupier of an adjoining premises objects to the proposed extension, then the Local Planning Authority will assess the impact of the proposal on the amenity of all adjoining premises. 21.10.09 Reports from Working Parties and Committees

- Bypass Open Day Jan Williamson / Dave Willett 11th December is the official opening ceremony. 9.30-10.30am reception in VH for VIPs. VIPS to be driven to the site via minibus to the ceremony site at the Albury Road bridge. 11.00 everyone can access the bypass. Registration is for 200 cars, from tile kiln roundabout for the first 400 metres. Registration went in days, 403 adults 97 children. Of which 132 are cyclists. Marshalls will be asking for a voluntary contribution to park and the funds will be towards the village hall refurbishment. Refreshments will be in the VH. All the drone videos will be on loop in the VH. There will also be some archaeological finds from the site in the VH.
- Volunteers Event Cllr Westlake successful event, 38 attended. Food and drink provided by the VH, and the Nags Head provided Indian food compliments of 'H.' This event was an opportunity to thank volunteers for all the hard work they have put in over the last two years. £206.48 was the final spend. £200 was the original approved budget.

- Allotments Cllr Wilkinson Had a meeting in November. Cllr Wilkinson, suggest
 we create a post for an allotment manager at 9 hours per month at £12.50 at
 £112.50 month and have a trial of 6 months. Cllr Wilkinson proposed we raise this
 role, Cllr Hoodless seconded, all councillors agreed. Motion carried. The role will be
 advertised.

 21.10.10 Reports to the Council To receive reports from representatives on outside bodies, local authorities, and agencies
 - District Councillor Report Cllr Williamson opened new leisure centre in grange paddocks. Government have launched green homes grant delivery scheme its money to help fund energy improvements to homes. Action: Cllr Williamson to send a link through to see what the eligibility is. Public enquiry for Chape Lane is next month on the 18^{th of} January. Planning inspector gave permission February last year subject to a number of conditions. The landowners have now appealed the May decision. Where another planning inspector will either uphold the appeal or its dismissed. Action: Cllr Williamson to find out what happens if the appeal is dismissed, can the landowners appeal. Cllr Wilkinson identified there has been burning on the site last weekend, black acrid material. Also, the increased amount of hardcore on site. Cllr Williamson said there are now more staff in the planning office and now clearing the backlog. 9th busiest district in the country.
 - Village Hall Jan Williamson first trial streaming event of the Village Hall consortium. Could be a possible use for PC meetings Craft Fayre made £500 clear profit for the VH kitchen. Food distribution from Oleo is going well and M&S distribution on a Monday is also proving popular. The key is to divert it from landfill. Applied for two grants Clarion towards the new curtains. Clarion Digital Unite to keep our digital workshop going for the next 2 years. Hall will be shut until the 21st, and windows will be out, and new windows installed. All relevant bodies that use the hall have been told. Insurance is £6,500 now instead of £6,000. Insurers said the letter has to come from EA to get the reduction on the insurance. Action: Jan to send insurance policy to Cllr Faraday who will get an expert opinion on it.
 - Village Hall signage Dave Willett Applying to HCC for signage on both sides of the road to indicate where the entrance to the village hall is. Asking if we can request payment from the PC. Action: Dave Willett to send costings to Cllr Faraday for consideration at the Finance meeting
 - **Police Report** Cllr Mardell Damage to a front door of a property in red brick cottage, no suspects. Damage to windscreen wipers to person at the same cottage, no suspects. Damage to windscreen wipers on Ford Hill. **Action: Cllr Faraday asked Cllr Mardell to request Leon attends a meeting.**

21.10.11 Chair's Report

- Following the November meeting I am grateful to Mrs Gillian Webster for hosting myself and Jono Forgham at Suffyldes Wood/Way Gap Piece. We toured the site, discussed the history and her future intentions and I have had engagement with EHDC on the same subject throughout the month.
- I attended the Stansted Airspace Modernisation consultations on departure and arrival routes. There is a separate agenda item at the meeting.
- I have had discussions with Komplan regarding the installation of outdoor gym and obstacle course equipment and drafted the EHDC grant application to that effect. I'll be having further discussions with Caloo, an alternative provider on their offering.
